# The Victorians - Autumn term

## Foundation subjects

- Study the architecture of the Victorians.
- Print William Morris style wall paper.
- Watercolour a skyscape in the style of Turner.
- Learn Spanish numbers to 30.
- Learn Spanish months of the year and days of the week.
- Develop fundamentals of movement.
- Develop Athletics skills.
- Learn Book Creator tools including inserting, formatting and create a hyperlinks.
- Understand Cyberbullying and know how to keep safe.
- E-Safety - social media, apps and games.
- Learn religious symbols and explore their meaning.



## Science

- Identify how sounds are made.
- Find patterns between the pitch and volume of a sound.
- Compare and group materials according to whether they are solids, liquids or gases.
- Observe materials and recognise how they change states when heated and cooled.

## Numeracy

- Compare numbers up to 9,999.
- Round numbers to 10,100,1000.
- Know Roman Numerals to 50.
- Develop problem solving skills through investigation, using money, measures and shape.
- Develop formal written methods for all four operations.
- Develop strategies for mental maths
- Consolidation of times tables.
- Compare and convert money from pounds to pence.
- Add and subtract fractions.

## Literacy

- Read and discuss a range of stories
- Write stories focusing on characters and settings.
- Read Victorian information texts.
- Create information texts about the Victorian period using IT.
- Use fronted adverbials correctly.
- Use expanded noun phrases with modifying adjectives.
- To use inverted commas for direct speech.
- To understand the difference between plural and possessive apostrophes.
